17 OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING OR SITE (interior and/or exterior)
 Facade has entry to left, modern picture window to the right. Most sash is recent 1-over-1.
 Entry shelter on large consoles with elaborate scroll cut-outs. Molded cornice shows partial return. Left elevation has modern carport.

19 HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE
 This house is one of a number of relatively similar small houses built on Buckley Hill during the last years of the 19th century. This house was built about 1895 by Samuel Stone, who was born in Canada in 1839, married Lucy Lalumier (also a Canadian native) and died in Thompson in 1908.
 Historically, the building is significant as one of a number of privately owned houses surrounding the company controlled mill housing of the Grosvenor Dale Company's 1872 mill in North Grosvenordale (located just to the west). These houses were built by, and in many cases occupied by, the modest middle class supported by the village's hugh textile operations. The Stones and the Rawsons, from whom they bought this house lot, were typical of these small scale landowners. In 1919, this house was sold to Hermenegilde Beauregard, who owned two stores in North Grosvenordale and another house on Buckley Hill.
 Architecturally, the building is highly altered. The jigsawn consoles of the entry hood are the only remaining original feature of note.
