17 OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING OR SITE (interior and/or exterior)

Five-bay facade, central entry. Wood door c. 1920 with three vertically oriented panes. Sash generally five vertical panes over one. Three-bay porch with square posts and balusters, molded rail. Plain corner boards and frieze. Right rear entry sheltered by c. 1890 porch on turned posts.

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19 HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE

This simple vernacular house was built about 1850 by Albert Frissell, who died in 1882. Like many of his neighbors, Frissell was a man of modest means, his \$62 estate included five barrels of russet (sic) apples, a wagon, and a shotgun.

This house is architecturally significant as a good example of a mid 19th century vernacular house. It's simple ridge-parallel-to-street plan and symmetrical five-bay facade are typical of many small houses built at the time. Many, such as the neighboring house at 212 Hagstrom Road, feature Greek Revival detailing.
