20 SUBSEQUENT FIELD EVALUATION:

17 OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING OR SITE (interior and/or exterior)

Five-bay facade, central entry. Sash generally 6-over-1. Wood door has single large light over panels. Sidelights, border-pane storm door. Entry has wide fluted surround; square corner blocks with turned circular bosses. Open pediment portico on Tuscan columns, molded rail, square balusters.

Above, attic story is treated as full width shed dormer; decorative cornice applied to form gambrel roof profile. Side elevations have radial glazed semi-circular attic windows; right has added or altered framed-in one story porch.

19 HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE

This house is one of several moved in 1966 to make way for the flood-control reservoir that all but eliminated the village of West Thompson. Built about 1935, it is architecturally significant as one of Thompson's few examples of the Colonial Revival style.

Colonial Revival architecture, most popular from about 1900 to 1930, was loosely based on the classically based formal architecture of the 18th century. In this relatively modest home, detailing is confined mainly to the sidelighted entry, the open pediment portico, and the radial-glazed attic windows. The decorate "gambrel" cornice is a relatively common feature in Colonial Revival houses; it is intended to recall the dwellings of early Dutch settlers.
