20 SUBSEQUENT FIELD EVALUATION:

17 OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING OR SITE (interior and/or exterior)
 Three-bay facade, central entry. Sash generally has five or six vertically-arrayed panes over one large pane.
 Hip roof extends to form fullwidth front porch. Porch has tapered square posts on shingled bases, square balusters, molded rail, plain frieze with central molding, overhanging eaves, plain cornice. Frieze carries on both side elevations. Central wood shingled hip-roofed roof dormer has paired windows. Right elevation has rectangular bay window, added rear porch. Left elevation relatively plain.

19 HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE
 Harold E. Reynolds built this well preserved bungalow about 1930. Its primary significance is architectural.
 The bungalow style introduced in California just after 1900, grew out of the English Arts and Crafts movement, which stressed a return to picturesque, hand-crafted construction. Due in large part to the wide publication of standard house plans, the "California Bungalow" became one of the most popular small house types of the early 20th century. The hip roof found on this example is relatively uncommon, but the Reynolds house has a variety of bungalow features, including the extension of the roof-line to form a porch, the use of contrasting materials (clapboards and shingles), the unusual sash, and the irregular fenestration.
 Dormers and rectangular bay windows are also common bungalow features.
