DESCRIPTION (Continued)	17 OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING OR SITE (interior and/or exterior)
	<p>Five-bay facade, central entry has paneled wood door with rectangular stained-glass sidelights. Fluted pilasters and lintel with plain corner blocks. Sash generally 2-over-2; windows have simple molded caps. One-story full-width porch has projecting pedimented peak centered on entry bay. Other porch detail: slender Tuscan columns with entasis, turned balusters, molded rail, plain frieze with top and bottom moldings, molded cornice.</p> <p>House has plain corner boards, molded cornice, partial return. To rear, short connector to large parallel rear wing.</p>

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SIGNIFICANCE	19 HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE
	<p>This house was built about 1840 by Jason Phipps, Jr. and his wife Abeline Town Phipps and extensively remodelled just after 1900, probably by Allen T. Babbit. Phipps (1802-1874) was a laborer, a fact reflected in the relatively modest scale of this house.</p> <p>The plain corner boards, symmetrical five-bay facade, and ridge-parallel-to-street orientation are typical of small mid 19th-century dwellings in northeastern Connecticut. The 20th-century modifications are now architecturally significant in their own right. The use of stained glass is typical of the late Victorian period, the Tuscan-columned porches reflects the renewed fondness for classical precedents which was soon to culminate in the Colonial Revival style.</p> <p>Historically, it is significant as part of a large assemblage of 19th and 20th century dwellings in the village center of Thompson Hill.</p>
