later at a house in Three Rows, the mill village neighborhood once known as "Little Canada".

In 1872, Putnam's priest, Father Vygen, purchased 12 acres of land strategically located between Grosvenordale and North Grosvenordale. He hired Louis P. Lamoureux to design and build a church and parish house at a cost of \$10,000. The building was dedicated in September, 1872, and named after St. Joseph, the patron saint of French Canada. The first priest was Hyachinthe Martial, a French speaking Belgian.

Historically, St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Church is significant as a longtime community institution in Thompson, and for its connection with the Grosvenordale's French-Canadian community, the villages' most significant and numerous ethnic group during the late 19th century.

Architecturally, it is somewhat altered by modern siding, but is significant as a good example of the Gothic Revival style. The Gothic Revival began as a whimsical mode for country houses in mid 18th century England, spread to America as a domestic style in the 1840s and 1850s, and was revived in the Victorian era as a style for churches and other public buildings. Typical Gothic features present here include the buttress like pilasters, the use of quatrefoil and pointed arched forms, and the steep roof gable.
